## CEO's Corner

### Flooding Event

The contractors are estimated to have completed 38% of outstanding works.

There are a number of roads that the remediation works have now been completed, if you have any concerns with the completed works please let us know and the quality of work can be inspected and repaired if required.

As this work is being carried out, the Shire would like to remind road users to be courteous and slow down within the areas crews are working, this will allow them to do their job in a safe manner and complete it sooner. Unfortunately we continue have had a number of reports of vehicles speeding through road works.

### 4WDL Meeting – Tuesday 8 May 2018

On Tuesday 8 May 2018, I attended a 4WDL CEOs Meeting in Wagin. The key topics of discussion were:

- Exploring opportunities for internet connectivity improvements across our six regional shires. We are exploring the possibility of undertaking a feasibility study or review of our current digital infrastructure.
- Astro-Tourism Presentation – The Stargazers Club WA are looking to establish Astro-Tourism Towns. The Perth domestic market seeks dark night skies in places that are safe and close to Perth, this includes

Astronomical Societies, Clubs, Astrophotography/ Photography Group. Science based activities are attractive for local Perth families due to their educational nature. This may be an opportunity to build on our community's economy and diversify our tourism options.

### 'Future of CRCs' Meeting – Monday 14 May 2018

A number of CRC Managers and Shire representatives met again in Narembeen On Monday 14 May to workshop opportunities that may be presented to the State Government to assist with their budget reform agenda.

The key points from the meeting were;

- CRCs deliver far more services in communities than what the funding contract stipulates
- The criteria for funding/tiers identified by the State Government need to be clear and transparent
- CRCs want to be involved in the review and the development of alternative revenue streams.

## Pension and Senior Card Advice

Under the Rates and Charges (Rebates and Deferments) Act 1992, the Local Governments are required to periodically review all pensioners.

If any of the details checked do not match, the claim may be rejected and concessions may be amended or cancelled.

Therefore, some things that pensioners and seniors may need to consider and advise the Shire about are:

- Do I hold a Commonwealth Seniors Health Card as well as a Seniors Card and am I only registered at the Shire with my Seniors Card?
- Has my partner also now received a card and we have not completed a joint application yet?
- As I am now not working more than 25 hours per week and am over 60, have I applied for a Seniors Card yet?
- Has the ownership of my property changed recently?
- Have I moved from one property to another and not made a new application for concessions with Water Corporation yet?
- Has my spouse ceased occupation of the property and I have not completed a new application?

If you work more than 25 hours per week, you are no longer eligible to have the Seniors Card and must return the card to Department of Community Services with a note advising them of your situation.

Unfortunately if concessions are cancelled, pensioners/seniors do not get their rebates again until new applications are made.



KidSport enables eligible Western Australian children aged 5 to 18 years to participate in community sport and recreation by offering them financial assistance of up to \$150 per calendar year towards club fees.

### Who is eligible for KidSport?

All Western Australian children aged 5 to 18 with a valid Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card are eligible for KidSport. Find your nearest club through <https://www.dsr.wa.gov.au/portal/find-a-club>.

### How does KidSport work?

You can apply for KidSport online or by using a hard copy application form.

KidSport applications are assessed by the local government in which the child resides or by the KidSport team at Sport and Recreation (WA). If an application is approved, the KidSport team will email you a voucher code (unique to the child). The code needs to be provided to the club when registering so that the approved amount can be deducted from the registration or membership fees. 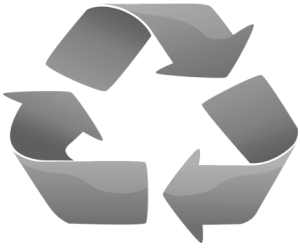

Recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility.

If items which are not recyclable are found the content can't be recycled and the load will be directed to landfill.

If an item is covered in food, it is not recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminants in the recycling process.

Please remember to rinse out cups, cans, jars etc. before throwing them in the bin.
