

Summary

For Council to consider calling of eQuote for provision of Project Management services for Western Australian Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (WANDRRA) funded re-instatement works in the Shire of Lake Grace.

Background

The administration of the Shire has received confirmation of funding for re-instatement works from Main Roads Western Australia, for \$10,604,882 on Friday 9 June 2017.

Administration sought permission from the Integrated Planning Asset Management Committee on 14 June 2017 and is now seeking permission from Council to tender for Project Management of re-instatement works.

Comment

Now that confirmation of funding has been received, staff are required to progress re-instatement works. The volume of project management and construction works far exceeds internal capacity, and as such temporary engagement of a third party Project Manager is the best way to proceed.

It is proposed that eQuote is called through Western Australian Local Government Association (WALGA) for provision of Project Management services, through the Preferred Supplier Program. By using the Preferred Supplier Program we do not need to publicly invite tenders, thus reducing the timeframe to appoint a Project Manager. WALGA are to be engaged to assist with running the Preferred Supplier Arrangement. This will be at a cost of \$2,524.50 GST Exclusive.

On successfully selecting a suitably qualified and competent Project Manager, the selected Project Manager will be responsible for calling of tender for required services such as provision of machinery, provision of materials and superintendent of works (supervisor). All recoups and justifications for funding will fall under the scope of this position. A general example is provided of a call for Project Management (attached Murchison Request for Quotation).

As the Project Manager will become responsible for calling of tenders to the satisfaction of the Council, this officer is confirming that tenders will comply with Council Policy 3.11 Tenders – Selection Criteria. Tenders for plant and materials called by the Project Manager will require endorsement by Council.

Council do not currently have an assessment criteria for the selection of a Project Manager. The following selection criteria are offered for Councils consideration.

Cost	25%
Key personnel	25%
Organisational experience	25%
Membership with Institute of Engineers	25%

Cost is generally the driving factor in most considerations, however, in this instance the officer believes that this is equal in importance to other considerations. Whilst cost is important, consideration needs to be balanced with the ability of candidates to retain viable quality control over projects in accordance with appropriate engineering standards, and as such, membership to the Institute of Engineers needs to be an integrated factor.

Key Personnel is also important as the project will be past the ability of any one individual. Support and capacity will be required by appropriately qualified, reputable members of a suitable profession.

Organisational experience will need to be demonstrated. Conversation with other local works managers has highlighted failures in third party management in relation to timeliness in construction of projects. This has principally been related by engagement with only one large contractor, rather than a diversity of operational options to ensure that as many operators as feasibly possible are involved in the reconstruction process as is practicably manageable. A defining criteria in managing multiple teams will be past experience. There will be little room for error due to inexperience in this process, and as such demonstration of history of similar works will be required to ensure that the Shire obtains best quality for dollar through this process.

Membership with Institute of Engineers is a defining factor in ensuring compliance with current engineering standards such as the *Australian Road Research Board* (ARRB) guidelines, and an understanding of Shire Policy documents. Council have demonstrated through discussion a high desire to comply with engineering standards in relation to road construction, and have mandated this standard for staff in Policy 5.8 Unsealed Roads – Standards.

Legal Implications

Local Government Act 1995

3.57. Tenders for providing goods or services

- (1) A local government is required to invite tenders before it enters into a contract of a prescribed kind under which another person is to supply goods or services.
- (2) Regulations may make provision about tenders.

Local Government (Function and General) Regulations 1996 – Part 4 Provision of goods and services

11. When tenders have to be publicly invited

- (1) Tenders are to be publicly invited according to the requirements of this Division before a local government enters into a contract for another person to supply goods or services if the consideration under the contract is, or is expected to be, more, or worth more, than \$150,000 unless subregulation (2) states otherwise.
- (2) Tenders do not have to be publicly invited according to the requirements of this Division if -
 - (a) the supply of the goods or services is to be obtained from expenditure authorised in an emergency under section 6.8(1)(c) of the Act; or
 - (b) the supply of the goods or services is to be obtained through the WALGA Preferred Supplier Program; or
 - (c) within the last 6 months —
 - (i) the local government has, according to the requirements of this Division, publicly invited tenders for the supply of the goods or services but no tender was submitted that met the tender specifications or satisfied the value for money assessment; or
 - (ii) the local government has, under regulation 21(1), sought expressions of interest with respect to the supply of the goods or services but no person was, as a result, listed as an acceptable tenderer; or
 - (d) the contract is to be entered into by auction after being expressly authorised by a resolution of the council of the local government; or
 - (e) the goods or services are to be supplied by or obtained through the government of the State or the Commonwealth or any of its agencies, or by a local government or a regional local government; or
 - (ea) the goods or services are to be supplied —
 - (i) in respect of an area of land that has been incorporated in a district as a result of an order made under section 2.1 of the Act changing the boundaries of the district; and
 - (ii) by a person who, on the commencement of the order referred to in subparagraph (i), has a contract to supply the same kind of goods or services to the local government of the district referred to in that subparagraph; or
 - (f) the local government has good reason to believe that, because of the unique nature of the goods or services required or for any other reason, it is unlikely that there is more than one potential supplier; or
 - (g) the goods to be supplied under the contract are —
 - (i) petrol or oil; or
 - (ii) any other liquid, or any gas, used for internal combustion engines; or
 - (h) the following apply —
 - (i) the goods or services are to be supplied by a person registered on the Aboriginal Business Directory WA published by the Small Business Development Corporation established under the Small Business Development Corporation Act 1983; and
 - (ii) the consideration under the contract is \$250 000 or less, or worth \$250 000 or less; and
 - (iii) the local government is satisfied that the contract represents value for money; or
 - (i) the goods or services are to be supplied by an Australian Disability Enterprise; or
 - (j) the contract is a renewal or extension of the term of a contract (the original contract) where —

- (i) the original contract was entered into after the local government, according to the requirements of this Division, publicly invited tenders for the supply of goods or services; and
 - (ii) the invitation for tenders contained provision for the renewal or extension of a contract entered into with a successful tenderer; and
 - (iii) the original contract contains an option to renew or extend its term; and
 - (iv) the supplier's tender included a requirement for such an option and specified the consideration payable, or the method by which the consideration is to be calculated, if the option were exercised; or
- (k) the goods or services are to be supplied by a pre-qualified supplier under Division 3.

12. Anti-avoidance provision for r. 11(1)

- (1) This regulation applies if a local government intends to enter into 2 or more contracts (the contracts) in circumstances such that the desire to avoid the requirements of regulation 11(1) is a significant reason for not dealing with the matter in a single contract.

Financial Implications

With any approved WANDRRA funding the limit for local government contribution is 1% of Total Rates Levied as per the 2016 WA Local Government Directory or 0.25% of WA's first threshold for the financial year 2016-17. For the Shire of Lake Grace the limit of contribution is \$153,400. A percentage is deducted from each claim until that amount is reached.

The engagement of WALGA to undertake the Preferred Supplier Arrangement eQuote is \$2,524.50 GST Exclusive.
